While there, she was able to tour some of the area work and projects that we support or are involved in. She especially enjoyed a visit with Sr. Kathleen Durkin to an urban apple orchard, bringing healthy food to the city.

In Cleveland, **Bishop Edward Malesic** celebrated Mass and performed a Dedication and Blessing of the newly built Hall of St. Agnes + Our Lady of Fatima Parish. Bishop Malesic told the parishioners and others at Mass that Jesus called us to look after one another, especially those who are more vulnerable. "This parish does that well and looks out for the neighborhood," he said, "I am especially happy to be here tonight to bless and dedicate the parish hall. Dream big on what it can be used for. Use it to draw people together and feed their souls as well as their bodies...The world, as you know, can be a very cold place. Warm it up with the light of Christ."
